Tafa and Emily were good friends. They played together all the time.


Every morning they walked along the beach to school.

Emily felt disappointed. After all, they spotted the shell at the same time, and it was the most shiny shell they had ever seen.




Tafa put the shell into the pocket of his shorts as they walked home along the beach.

Little did Tafa know that there was a hole in the pocket of his shorts, big enough for a small shell to fall through. He did not notice that the shell had slipped down into the sand.




But Emily did notice....and while Tafa walked along, she bent down quickly and put the shiny shell into the pocket of her dress.

But Emily had other things to do and quickly said, "No I have homework to do. See you tomorrow."




Just then, Tafa put his hand in his pocket to pull out the shell, but it wasn't there. "I have lost my beautiful shell!" he screamed.

Tafa started to cry. Emily just stood there, not knowing what to say or do. So she did not say anything and went into her house.




Emily felt bad about what happened, but it felt so good to have that shiny shell in her pocket. She took it out and held it carefully in her hand. It was so beautiful.
